As Chapter Webmaster, I have the privilege of introducing you all to the revamped Beta Gamma Epsilon Chapter website for the 2023-2024 academic year. To begin with, our landing page has been updated. When you visit www.starkstateptk.org you no longer land on an about page. Instead, you land on a welcome page with pictures of our campuses, a map of where they're located, and menus guiding you to the other pages on our site.

The previous landing page/about page can be reached by clicking the about link in the menu. It has been edited to include Greek letters and an emphasis on our four PTK hallmarks: scholarship, leadership, service, and fellowship. It also includes a link to the Become a Member page. The About tree on our website also has a link to a page with Phi Theta Kappa's Mission Statement.

The Second tree in the webpage menu also has two links. It links to a page with a video informing people about the benefits of Phi Theta Kappa Membership. It also links to a page with information on how to join PTK.

The Chapter Events link is potentially the one you'll want to make the most use of. This link takes you to a calendar of all the events our chapter is involved in. The information about these events should include location, time, whom you can contact about them and how to contact them, and any other relevant information you might need to know like dress code and supplies necessary. This events calendar will be kept up to date throughout the school year.

The News link is where you'll find your favorite quarterly organizational newsletter, the Bugle, as currently edited by Beta Gamma Epsilon chapter secretary/newsletter editor, Abbie Crawford. The Bugle, for those who don't know, is a great way to learn about what the chapter has been doing, what plans the chapter has for the next few months, and learn more about your chapter officers, advisors, and other things of interest to local Phi Theta Kappans. The Resources and Links tree of the webpage menu has five links. The first link is our chapter bylaws, which is useful for all members and especially officers to be aware of. The second connects to a page with information and links for scholarship applications and opportunities. The third resource goes to our Officers Page. On the Officers page you can find pictures of all our current chapter officers and advisors. Look for this to be moved to the About tree and brief bios to be added. The fourth resource is a Q/A page with many commonly asked questions and their answers. Several answers have been recently updated to reflect changes in personnel and policy since the last update. Finally, the fifth resource is a page with past recorded meetings that is not currently functional. I will fix or remove this page soon.

The last link along the webpage menu is a for a Privacy Policy page. This explains what information may be collected when you browse our webpage and how we will or will not use that information.

On the left side of the screen is an additional menu showing the headlines of all the recent blog posts that have been posted on our webpage. Current posts include information about the Regional Awards last Spring, a Welcome to our Honorary member, Randy Shipman, who was inducted this summer, and a nod to the post about our chapter president, Tammy Monroe, who was featured on Stark State's website and social media accounts.

In the future, I have plans to enhance our site further with more pictures, more detailed information, and additional pages on how members can get involved. These may include information on signing into out Microsoft Teams accounts and information about our College Project and Honors In Action project.
